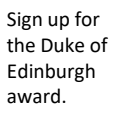

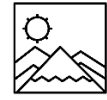

Our extreme Earth will be understood.

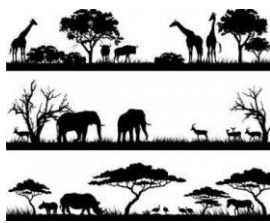
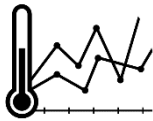

Simple fieldwork and observational skills begin to be taught.



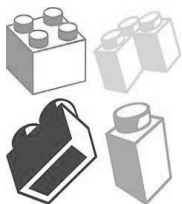
