#### This half term we are learning:

**English:** In English, we will be completing a narrative unit called 'The Secret of Black Rock' and creating our very own adventure stories. We will then be moving on to writing an informal letter based on the book 'The Gardener'.

**Maths:** We will be focussing on the formal written methods for both multiplication and division. We will also be looking at money including recognising the value of coins, combining amounts, giving change and problem solving.

**Science:** Our new Science topic will focus on rocks and soils. We will find out about different types of rocks, how fossils are formed and different layers of soil.

**History:** In History, we will be learning about the Windrush generation. We will be finding out about the impact of the Windrush generation on life today.

**Geography:** Our geographical work will be based around temperate deciduous forests. We will look at location, flora and fauna, and layers. We will then compare this biome with our knowledge of tropical rainforests.

**Art:** We will be learning all about Andy Warhol and the pop art era. We will be creating our own art using ink printing techniques.

**Music:** Our lessons will continue to be focussed around instruments of the orchestra. Our recorder playing is sounding amazing and we will be increasing our repertoire of songs.

**French:** We will be learning lots of French vocabulary related to animals.

**PSHE:** In our PSHE lessons, we will be looking at the topic 'Celebrating Differences'.

**PE:** In PE this half-term, we will be learning lots of different tennis skills.

**RE:** We will be learning all about different Jewish celebrations.

**Computing:** In our computing lessons, we will be continuing our work on coding before moving onto a focus on touch typing.
